Beyond academic and physical growth, what touched me most was the development of character. I saw kindness in shared materials, patience while waiting for a turn, empathy toward friends, and resilience when challenges arose. These values—care, respect, responsibility, and confidence—are foundations that will stay with the children long after specific skills are learned.



Our Christmas Concert 2025

On December 3, 2025, ISMILE Bandung was filled with joy, music, and festive cheer as we celebrated our Christmas Concert 2025. Held in two sessions, the event allowed every class to take part while giving families the opportunity to enjoy and appreciate each performance.

The celebration began with an introduction by Ms. Kathleen, our emcee, who warmly set the tone for a joyful program. This was followed by a beautiful praise song, "Prince of Peace," presented by the N2B class, gently leading everyone into the true spirit of Christmas.

Following a short break, families gathered once again for the second session of the concert. HOLIDAY PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

The children embarked on a heartwarming journey through our Christmas Wonders holiday programme exploring the true meaning of Christmas through joy, kindness, creativity, and meaningful experiences. Each day was thoughtfully designed to spark curiosity, imagination, and a deeper appreciation of the season's magic.

DAY 1: WHAT MAKES CHRISTMAS SPECIAL?

We began our week by talking about what makes Christmas special and how we prepare for this joyful season. The children expressed their ideas through creative art activities such as making natural Christmas ornaments, cardboard Christmas stockings, Christmas flowers using popsicle sticks, shiny paper and shiny pipe cleaner and modeling clay ornaments shaped with cookie cutters.

The day was enriched with the storytelling of *The Night Before Christmas*, helping the children imagine the excitement of Christmas Eve. Music and movement added to the joy as the children played and danced using DIY shakers and tambourines they created themselves.



DAY 2: COLORS AND LIGHTS OF CHRISTMAS

Our focus shifted to the beauty of Christmas lights and stars. The children explored a star-themed sensory table, completed star puzzles, and experimented with star printing. They enjoyed playing in the light room and creating lanterns using recycled plastic bottles. Artistic expressions continued with Starry Night paintings and nature star wands. The day concluded with a story about the Christmas star, encouraging wonder and curiosity.

DAY 3: THE GIFT OF GIVING

This day focused on kindness and generosity. We discussed what a gift is and reflected on how gifts can be made with love. The children created Christmas cards and decorated Christmas bags for sharing. They enjoyed music and movement, bracelet making, and participated in snack preparation by making bread decorated with jam and sprinkles using cookie cutters. We concluded the day with the story *The Gift of Nothing*, reminding us that love and thoughtfulness are the greatest gifts of all.



DAY 4: CHRISTMAS IN NATURE

The children explored how animals experience Christmas and winter, connecting the season to the natural world. They worked together to build a cozy bug hotel, created natural rain sticks, and made Christmas nature seed collages. The story The Christmas Owl encouraged empathy and care for living things, highlighting the importance of kindness not only to people but also to nature.



DAY 5: CHRISTMAS CELEBRATION DAY

Our week ended with a joyful celebration filled with sensory and creative activities. The children enjoyed filling snowman sensory bags, creating DIY mini Christmas trees and Q-tip Christmas trees, exploring winter salt art, and making snowman marshmallow skewers. As the culminating activity, the children sang and danced joyfully to Christmas songs, celebrating all they had learned and experienced throughout the week.

A Joyful End of Term 2:


Celebrating Learning, Laughter, and Christmas Cheer


