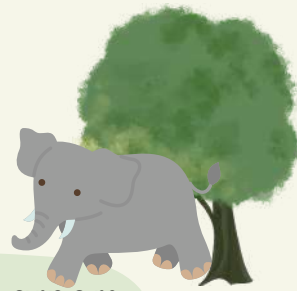

Elephant Swamp

The Benefits

Sensory: Encourages tactile awareness and curiosity.

Fine motor skills: Scooping, squeezing, and stirring strengthen little hands and fingers.

Imagination and creativity: Children create their own stories in the swamp world!

Calming play: The soothing textures support mindfulness and focus. (NP)

Let's Gather Our Swampy Supplies!

- **1 cup** of Cornstarch
- **½ cup** of Water
- **2 tbsp** Basil seeds
- Green-dyed spaghetti
- Elephant figures and smooth pebbles
- Small cups, spoons, and natural sticks

Prepare the base

Soak 2 tablespoons of basil seeds in water overnight. Mix them with 1 cup cornstarch and ½ cup water until the texture is smooth and gooey — just like thick mud.

Add the greenery

Dye cooked spaghetti with green food coloring, let it dry, and scatter it across your swamp.

Decorate

Place in smooth stones, small sticks, and toy elephants.

Puppet Show

On October 10, 2025, ISMILE Permata Hijau hosted an enriching professional development workshop titled ***"The Magic of Storytelling with Puppets."*** Led by guest presenter Ms. Erlina Kwan, an experienced storyteller and early childhood educator, the session provided our teachers with fresh insights and hands-on techniques to bring stories to life in joyful and imaginative ways.

Storytelling has always been at the heart of early childhood education. Children connect deeply with stories they listen, imagine, and feel. The goal of this training was to help teachers explore how storytelling can be transformed into an immersive learning experience that captures children's attention and supports their development.

Ms. Erlina highlighted that puppets are powerful teaching tools. Puppets can stimulate imagination and creativity, enrich vocabulary and language structure, and make moral lessons and values easier to understand.

Throughout the workshop, teachers observed live demonstrations of how simple gestures, tone changes, and character movements can shift the mood of a story. Teachers practiced using different types of puppets hand puppets, stick puppets, shadow puppets and experimented with voice modulation. One of the greatest outcomes of this workshop was the renewed energy and creativity it brought to our teaching community. 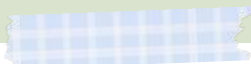
Day 3

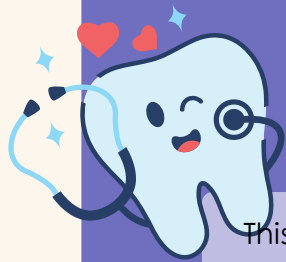
